(ACT) PROGRAM

ACT offers community-based mental health care for adults living with a serious mental illness that interferes with their ability to live in the community, attend appointments, and manage mental health symptoms.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Teams based in Dallas and Waxahachie provide services throughout Dallas, Collin, Ellis, Hunt, Kaufman, Navarro, and Rockwall counties.

For program eligibility, each individual should meet the following criteria:

MUST BE
AGES 18+

SERIOUS
MENTAL
ILLNESS
DIAGNOSIS

An individual seeking ACT services must also meet **one** of the following criteria:

- 2 psychiatric hospitalizations in the past 90 days (6 months)
- 4 psychiatric hospitalizations in the past 2 years
- 1 psychiatric hospitalization of longer than 30 days' duration within the past 2 years

ADDITIONAL ACT SERVICES

- Support, education, and skills training for family members
- Direct support to clients in obtaining legal and advocacy services, financial support and money management services, supported housing, and transportation

COMMUNITY

The Child & Family ACT team, made up of psychiatrists, therapists, nurses, social workers, employment specialists, and substance abuse specialists, works to help keep adults living with serious mental illness out of area psychiatric hospitals and stable in their homes.

The ACT team offers assistance with trauma, housing, medication management, social and coping skills training, employment, substance abuse, overcoming mental illness stigma, Social Security income applications, independent living skills, etc.

This service model allows Child & Family to maintain ACT program goals to:

- Lessen or eliminate the debilitating symptoms of mental illness
- Improve functioning in adult social and employment roles
- Enhance individual's ability to live independently in his or her own community
- Lessen family's burden of providing care

LOCATION & HOURS OF OPERATION

Services provided **24 hours a day, 7 days a week** - in the comfort of individual's **own home and community**.

Outpatient Competency Restoration (OCR)

Community-based services for individuals who have been diagnosed with a chronic, persistent mental illness and deemed incompetent to stand trial.

Safety Net (Drug Prevention & Intervention)

School & Community-based, youth program serving Dallas, Collin, & Denton counties via drug & alcohol education, goal-setting, stress management, communication skills, and anger management.

Youth Empowerment Services (YES)

Family-centered, community-based, program designed to help children and youth, ages 3 to 18, who are at risk of out-of-home placement due to serious mental, emotional, and behavioral difficulties.
